

AT THE RESORT

ACCOMMODATION

The Canadian Princess Resort offers two choices of accommodation. Cozy staterooms on board the ship offer a lot of nautical character! Each cabin has bunk style beds and a wash basin; showers and washroom facilities are shared with other guests and are conveniently located nearby. Shore accommodations next to the ship, contain rooms with two queen beds, cable, colour television and private bathrooms. For groups of three or four, large rooms are available with two additional beds in a loft.

DINING

Excellent meals are served in the Stewart Dining Room on board the ship. The Chart Room Lounge (with full beverage service) and the Quarterdeck Lounge are popular gathering places. Delicious boxed lunches may be ordered ahead for fishing trips.

No trip to Ucluelet is complete without a visit to the Wickaninnish Restaurant at Long Beach. The view alone is worth the trip! Inquire at Reception.

EXTRA COSTS

Canadian saltwater fishing licences, ice and insulated fish boxes are available at the South Terminal and the resort. Meals, beverages, boxed lunches and rain gear may be purchased at the resort.

MASTERFISHERMAN AND CAPTAIN'S CLUB

If you catch a Chinook over 50 lbs., a Coho over 20 lbs. or a halibut over 100 lbs. during your trip you become a member of the prestigious **Masterfisherman Club**. Masterfishermen are honoured with their name on a plaque, a coveted pin and 10,000 Fanatic Fishing Points which can be used towards trips and merchandise (see www.obmg.com/ffc).

If you catch a Chinook over 30 lbs. or a Coho over 15 lbs. during your trip you become a member of the new **Captain's Club** and get your name on the hall-of-fame website and the new Captain's Club pin.

GIFT SHOP

Be sure to visit our gift shop, where you will find quality clothing, souvenirs, sundry items and unique gifts.

PAYMENT

Cash, traveller's cheques, Visa, MasterCard and American Express are welcome. We regret we cannot accept personal cheques at the resort.

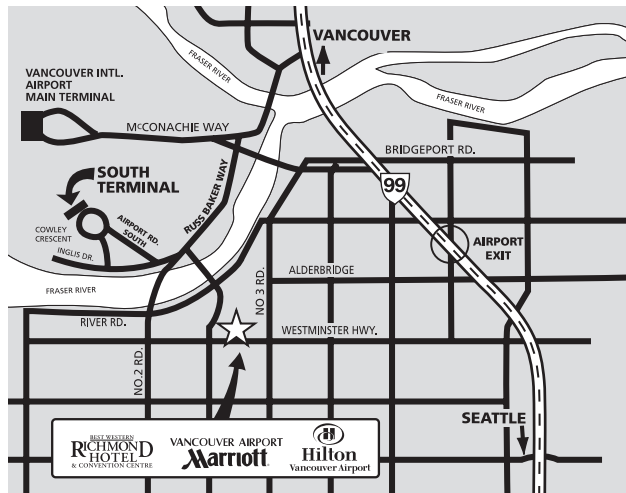

We strongly recommend you read the following Important Information before your departure.

BEFORE YOU LEAVE

WHAT TO BRING

Dress is casual however, please ensure that you bring the following:

- Warm Jacket
- Hat
- Gloves
- Heavy Socks
- Personal Toiletries
- Camera
- Sunglasses/Sunscreen
- Rubber Footwear

WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

Due to changes in Transport Canada's weight limits, we must strictly adhere to the 25 lb. limit for guest baggage. Please ensure that your baggage is limited to 25 lbs. Soft luggage (duffel bag) is best. Coolers are not allowed on flights.

MEDICATION

Do not forget any necessary medication. If you are prone to motion sickness, we recommend you bring your own treatment such as Gravol or Dramamine.

PLEASE KEEP YOUR MEDICATION WITH YOU AT ALL TIMES WHEN TRAVELLING, DO NOT PACK IN YOUR BAGS.

PLEASE ADVISE YOUR RESERVATION COORDINATOR OF ANY MEDICAL OR DIETARY REQUIREMENTS AT LEAST THREE WEEKS PRIOR TO YOUR ARRIVAL.

Guests flying between Canada and the US now require a passport.

Guests arriving in Canada by land or sea require either a passport or proof of citizenship (e.g. birth certificate) and current photo identification (e.g. driver's license).

If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Canada Customs at (204) 983-3500 or visit www.cbsa.gc.ca.

On your return trip home, it is vital to keep your fishing license with you - you may be asked to produce it by customs or the Dept. of Fisheries.

Note:

Oak Bay Marine Group is not responsible if a delay should occur at a border crossing or at customs. Please be aware that individuals with any kind of criminal record may not be allowed to enter Canada.

VANCOUVER & CONNECTIONS

FLY-IN PACKAGES TO CANADIAN PRINCESS

All trips begin and return to the South Terminal Airport next to the Vancouver International Airport in British Columbia, Canada. The Oak Bay Marine Group counter is located across from the food court in the South Terminal.

After check in at the Oak Bay Marine Group counter in the South Terminal, your adventure begins with a scenic 40-minute flight to Long Beach on Vancouver Island. Round trip flights are provided by charter aircraft. From Long Beach, you will be transferred by bus to the Canadian Princess Resort.

ARRIVING IN VANCOUVER

Due to the early check in time, we strongly recommend that you arrive in Vancouver the night prior to departure. See back panel for hotel options. It is also highly advisable to stay overnight in Vancouver on the last day of your trip, as weather conditions or air traffic may cause unforeseen delays. Oak Bay Marine Group is not responsible for any such delays.

OTHER VANCOUVER CONNECTIONS

Shuttle service to hotels is available at the lower level of the Vancouver Airport Main Terminal. Taxi and shuttle services are available between the Main and South Terminals.

PARKING

Paid parking is available at the South Terminal. Please inquire at the Oak Bay Marine Group counter for directions. Meters accept Visa, Mastercard, and coins only - please be prepared.

DRIVING TO THE CANADIAN PRINCESS

CHECK IN: 3:30pm CHECK OUT: 2:00pm

The Canadian Princess is permanently moored in a tranquil bay in Ucluelet. Guests driving to the resort can select one of several ferry routes to Vancouver Island. Following the Island Highway north, take the Port Alberni (HWY 4) exit and continue on to Ucluelet. The Canadian Princess Resort is located on the left hand side as you enter Ucluelet. The driving time from Nanaimo to Ucluelet is approximately 2 1/2 hours; from Victoria, 4 1/2 hours.

FISHING AT THE RESORT

FANTASTIC FISHING

Experienced skippers and deckhands will take you into the middle of the action. Our powerful 43' and 52' cabin cruisers depart daily at 6:00am for a seven-hour guided fishing charter. Optional afternoon fishing excursions are available for halibut or salmon from 2:00 pm to dusk, bottom fish from 2:30 - 6:30 pm and sunset salmon fishing from 4:30 pm until dusk.

TOP QUALITY GEAR AND EQUIPMENT

Our comfortable deep sea cabin cruisers have plenty of deck space, heated cabins and lavatory facilities. A professional skipper and boat crew accompany you on the trip and familiarize you with the equipment. We provide top quality mooching rods with star drag reels and drift fishing lures. Coffee and hot chocolate are available during fishing trips.

CARING FOR YOUR CATCH

Your fish will be cleaned and packaged in strong plastic bags, ready for you to take with you. If you are staying on at the resort, your catch will be refrigerated. Styrofoam coolers may be purchased at the resort.

If you are flying from the resort, our crew will clean, bag, label and refrigerate your fish, and it will arrive back in Vancouver with you, cold and fresh. Guests are responsible to care for their fish after arrival in Vancouver. Insulated boxes are available for purchase at the South Terminal in Vancouver. Should you prefer to have your catch canned or smoked, please inquire at the Front Desk, where arrangements will be made to forward your catch to the cannery for processing at a reasonable cost. The cannery will then forward it directly to you. There is a nominal fish cleaning charge for optional afternoon fishing charters.

WEATHER CONDITIONS

While we fully expect to adhere to the schedule outlined, please be aware that travel and fishing are subject to change due to weather conditions.
